SYMBOLIC

This type of ceremony has spiritual significance but no legal value. The person who officiates may be a friend or family member, or the wedding coordinator can suggest an appropriate minister.

CATHOLIC*

In the sacrament of matrimony, the future spouses go before an altar where they express their vows and swear eternal love before God, in total self-will and consent. This ceremony must be held in a chapel in order to be valid.

MAYAN

All elements of this ancestral celebration have a special meaning linked to nature, considered sacred and divine by the ancient Mayan civilization. The couple receives the blessing of the gods of creation through a shaman.

JEWISH

A ceremony with rituals full of elements that represent the beauty of the relationship and the obligations of the couple. The wedding takes place under the chuppah (wedding canopy), which symbolizes the home that will be built and shared.

SOUTH ASIAN

A wedding full of small rituals, symbols and practices that are intended to teach the couple lessons for their future common life and thus achieve marital, economic and eternal success.

PERSIAN

Divided into two, the first part of this ceremony is known as the "Aghd" which is the legal component, and the second is the "Jashn-e Aroosi", the wedding reception. The place where the ceremony is carried out is known as the Sofreh-ye Aghd, where all elements are gathered to symbolize God's blessing of the couple.
